In partnership with the staff and board, the Development Manager will plan, lead, organize, and execute strategies to raise philanthropic funds from a variety of sources for WNPA and its National Park Service (NPS) partners. They will create a compelling case for support and use it to raise funds and build awareness and visibility of WNPA locally, regionally and nationally.

Activities will include creating an annual development plan, cultivating donor relationships, representing WNPA in the community, creating new opportunities to expand the base of support, creating, and managing the Development budget. The Development Manager will coordinate with the executive team, to expand and diversify the organization's funder base. Excellent communication, collaboration, and organizational skills are the keys to success in this position. The incumbent must be self-motivated and who can motivate others to action and deliver positive results.

The philanthropy program is still relatively new to WNPA; the Development Manager will be required to help guide and influence the board, the organization at-large, and its NPS partners through a transition to a larger focus on fundraising
